

We were also delighted with the significant number of new commitments to the Foundation and we thank the members of the Foundation Executive who assisted in this task.



Lauren & David Shafer

A bit about Lauren and her connection to Mount Scopus.

I came to Mount Scopus in grade 3 when my family immigrated from South Africa. I recall an easy transition and a very positive and enjoyable experience during my entire schooling. I graduated in 2000. I currently have 4 children who all attend Mount Scopus. They are in Little Learners, grade 1, grade 3, and grade 5. I have two sisters who both attended Mount Scopus, and each of their children also do too – so my kids have lots of cousins at the School, making their experience very familiar and welcoming.

What are some key memories from your time at the school?

The school had a very warm, safe, familiar, fun and dynamic atmosphere. The ruach and community spirit were always evident during the chagim and assemblies. I remember the long drives between Templestowe and Burwood and being excited to arrive at school each day. The melodic singing of the hatikvah at the start of each assembly always moved me. I remember walking down Station Street for pizza dough rolls, and having lots of fun hanging with

friends on the Skolnik oval and on the quadrangle. I recall feeling a sense of fulfilment yet sadness at my year 12 farewell as my Scopus journey was coming to an end. Little did I realise that 14 years later I would be back starting a new journey at Mount Scopus – as a parent.

Ulpan was a highlight for me. It was my first overseas trip after immigrating from South Africa, and my first time to Israel. I recall feeling an instant connection to Israel which undoubtedly influenced me to volunteer in the Magen David Ambulance Service for three months after graduating and to try to pass on a love for Israel to my kids.

What did Scopus impart on you about being Jewish and your connection to Israel?

Scopus provided me with a wonderful education, but also importantly it provided me with a solid social network and participation in the wider Melbourne Jewish community which is very special to me.

Having a community and a sense of belonging is something we feel is very important to our family and something we have really come to appreciate even more

so since having children and helping them navigate childhood, COVID lockdowns and their early school years. A strong community atmosphere was important to maintaining a positive and healthy environment during the pandemic years – as the kids would regularly meet for walks around Caulfield Park with Scopus friends, and maintain healthy social lives.

The kids already have wonderful friends, from hard-working families with excellent values. These networks help to uplift and nurture the kids as they navigate an increasingly challenging world.

What does being a Foundation member mean to you?

Mount Scopus has been accommodating to our family – providing our kids an environment that makes them positive, engaged and happy at School.

They actually look forward to heading back to School after holidays and long breaks. David often jokes that the kids must be playing games all day as he's never seen kids so enthusiastic to go to School! Being a Foundation member is a small contribution from our family to help the School further its important work.



Shirley and Theo Sweet

A bit about Theo and his connection to Mount Scopus.

My parents were born in Grodno, Poland and came here in 1928 after they were married. When they arrived they lived in Carlton where I was born. We then moved to Kew, where my parents had built a new home and so I went to Xavier College, as it was the closest school, and there were no Jewish schools at the time.

I then married my beautiful wife Shirley and we had four children. We sent them to Mount Scopus College and have had no regret as they finished school and received degrees, had many wonderful friends (and friends that they still have today) and six of their children went to Scopus too.

The most important moment is seeing them happy playing with their friends in a great, nurturing and community minded environment.

All of our children and many grandchildren, even great grandchildren have been and are still attending Mount Scopus College. In fact, Shirley's brother attended Mount Scopus College and graduated in 1962.

What did Scopus impart on you about being Jewish?

We have always been aware that a solid Jewish education provides the framework to an appreciation and connection to our Jewish heritage. We believe it's very important to carry on the tradition, customs and religion through educating our younger generation at Scopus. By going to Mount Scopus College, it provides a social set up. We both went to non Jewish schools and unfortunately didn't receive the social connection compared to the generation that followed us that attended Jewish schools.

Why did you decide to give back to Scopus through the Foundation?

We believe in Scopus and a Jewish education. We believe that it is a great investment in our future, especially for generations to come.

What does being a Foundation member mean to you?

It means investing in our children, our grandchildren, our great grandchildren and our Jewish Melbourne community. Without our support and contribution we will slowly lose sight and connection to our Jewish and community heritage.

Embracing a new way of life

Kate Major, Director of Student Wellbeing

The World Health Organisation (WHO) describes wellbeing as a “resource for healthy living” which enables us to function well psychologically, physically, emotionally and socially. For us at Mount Scopus this in practice means that we strive to be the best we can be, are resilient and resourceful when faced with challenges, work fruitfully and with purpose and are connected contributors to our community.

In planning for 2022 and setting goals for student wellbeing we reflected on the amazing and complex experience we'd had over the past two years.

Approaching the start of the year, it seemed quite surreal that we're heading “back” to school, given that we won't ever return to the lives and expectations that we had prior to the pandemic.

As a staff we considered: *What might children have gained from the remote learning experience? How might we ensure we continue or amplify those things? What do we see as the most important things our students have missed out on? How might we work towards maximising opportunities for those things?*

Use our own ideas, thoughts and experiences combined with what educational experts were saying we developed the following priorities for the year:

- Build cohesion and a sense of belonging.
- Create space for expression of feelings, thoughts, and ideas.
- Establish routines to provide certainty and safety.
- Understand that the transition will be different for each person.
- Meet learners where they are at and focus on growth.
- Encourage learners to reflect on their learning and on themselves as learners, and to make decisions about how to move forward.

With these priorities in mind we have focused on Wellbeing initiatives that concentrate on relationships, social emotional learning, mental health literacy and help-seeking.

We began the year with Adolescent Mental Health Training for staff and in the Secondary School we started the delivery of our new Health and Social Emotional Learning structure.

The purpose of this was to put together a formalised scope and sequence of this subject taught by a team of teachers who receive specialised training to deliver it.

Topics we have covered include: Emotional Literacy, Puberty and Growing Up, Vaping and Risk, Consent and Respectful Relationships, Safer Partying and Mental Health.

In the Primary School we ran Parent Education sessions exploring Protective Behaviours, Cyber Safety, Puberty and Growing Up and Post-Pandemic Recovery. A highlight was our Tuning Into Kids Parent Education, where a group of our parents came together for a six week emotionally intelligent parenting course. A change we have made in the Secondary School has been reinstating Project Beyachad.

PBY is a vertical peer support program where Year 7's are paired with Year 10's and Year 8's are paired with Year 11's. Through hands-on fun activities and discussions, our students explored and applied a range of social and emotional skills, leading to improved positive social engagement in and beyond school.

Child Safeguarding has been a big focus for our school this year and will continue to be central to all that we do. Victorian schools are required under the Child Safety and Wellbeing Act to ensure that they implement compulsory child safe standards to protect students from harm. The Child Safe Standards set out to create safe places for students to fully and actively participate in the life of the community benefiting everyone. At Mount Scopus we have worked to build on our culture of child safety looking at our policies, practices, processes, training, education, curriculum and environment.

Living through a pandemic has impacted on how we operate in relationships and how we navigate within social groups. As we recovered, reconnected, reflected and continued to respond, it's fair to say 2022 has brought with it some challenges. This year, however, the joy we have in being together, growing and learning within a community has been something we are repeatedly and constantly grateful for in a way we haven't been able to appreciate before.




