President and CEO's Report

At the end of March 2020 the Foundation office was a hive of activity. Our CEO Mark Joel had commenced in this newly created role and the details of the planned visit by Ambassador Nikki Haley were being finalised with great anticipation.

Within a week, it would be no exaggeration to say that the world changed in a manner which no-one could have foreseen and with consequences that have materially changed people's lives. The true impact may not yet have been felt.

To the great credit of our school leadership and staff, the Scopus@home program was a resounding success; while no one wishes for its return, the cooperation and gratitude of our students and their families has been heart warming. Our report features a snapshot of images from the Scopus@home program which featured so heavily this year.

While the school transformed itself literally in a matter of days, the Foundation too, moved quickly in response to the crisis. By early April, we launched an Emergency Campaign amongst our membership. Our aim was, and remains, to stand behind the school's commitment to do everything reasonably possible to enable the continued retention of all students currently enrolled at the College. We watched with concern as the number of families calling for fee relief increased markedly through the first lockdown.

As we publish this report, we are encouraged by the strong levels of support from our members which has resulted in millions of dollars being raised. We thank those members who have responded to the call and we are continuing with our fundraising efforts as the financial devastation resulting from the pandemic continues to impact our families.

There are many learnings from the COVID19 pandemic and it is too early to tell how many of these will be enduring. But what we have seen in both general and Jewish communities worldwide is a return to core values; an understanding that things we once took for granted ought to be valued and nurtured. The importance of family, community and attending school; what it means when these most fundamental pillars of our society are suddenly restricted. When Jews cannot gather to pray, to be educated, to mourn, to celebrate; our very essence has been challenged.

But we are a people of hope; a people who believe that what may have been lost through this crisis - whether economically, politically, educationally, socially - can be rebuilt. Our early Zionist leaders much as our Scopus founders also knew that *Livnot U'lehibanot* - build and you are built; create and you are enriched; give and you will come to see life as a gift.

Similarly, as our children and grandchildren finally return to the physical classrooms and playgrounds of our wonderful school, the Foundation renews its commitment to stand behind the College in all its endeavours. We are renewed in our commitment to support families who want a world class Jewish education for their children; to build our Endowment Fund to provide a fund for the future; to raise funds for major capital projects; and to fund innovative programs within the school.

Our vision for the future relocation of Mount Scopus to the heart of the Jewish community is also renewed, and we look forward to sharing this with you when circumstances allow.

In the meantime, if you are able, please renew your commitment to Mount Scopus by renewing your commitment to the Foundation. It is amongst the most meaningful and impactful responses you can have in the midst of this extraordinary time.

Foundation Stories

Karen Stock-Schnall and Family

The Stock family were fortunate to have fled Vienna in the period immediately preceding the outbreak of the Second World War. Their influence upon the growth of the Melbourne Jewish community has been profound and their association with Mount Scopus has now entered its fifth generation.

Karen Stock-Schnall (OC73) and her husband Danny Schnall (OC70) recently renewed their commitment to the Foundation.

Karen recalls her earliest involvement with the school when she accompanied her grandfather Sigmund, who chaired one of the College's earliest Building Committees, to the College grounds. Sigmund's son, Garry, would go on to become President of the College. Karen too has held many significant roles from leading the Presentation Ball Committee in 1997 to being President of the Parents' Association and Vice President of the College. Karen is a Life Governor and maintains an active interest in the College.

The Stock family has had a long standing passion for the performing arts. Karen recalls that her parents loved attending performances in the Rose Hall featuring their grandchildren. In 1996, the family's philanthropy led to the dedication of the Susie and Eric Stock Drama Studio which was ultimately incorporated into the Besen Family Performing Arts Centre. In 2005, Karen dedicated the screen and image as part of the redevelopment of the Slezak Multimedia and Technology Centre in memory of her father.

Karen says that while she is incredibly excited at having grandchildren enrolled at Scopus she recognises the enormous commitment required by families to provide a Jewish day school education for their children. "My mother valued the sense of identity and community which Scopus instilled in us. Danny and I appreciated all that Scopus gave us and we have treasured the experiences of our children through the Scopus journey. But we also recognise the sacrifices which many families make. If we can help alleviate that burden in some small way then we feel we are carrying on to uphold our family's history and values"



Agnes and Joel Freeman

In the early 1980s, Agnes and Joel Freeman started looking for a school for their young son. Not only was the Kew campus of Scopus conveniently a few hundred metres from their home, but they felt it was also the best Jewish and secular education available for their three children. The teaching of Jewish traditions closely aligned with the Freemans and after Jeremy's enrolment into kinder, their daughters Larissa and Vanessa soon followed.

Agnes joined the School board, and was actively involved in efforts to sustain the Kew campus. She devoted countless hours to the College including establishing and growing the annual fashion parade into a major event, participating on the Ulpan sub-committee for many years, overseeing the relaunch of the school uniform and was Ball President in 2000. Agnes was appointed a Life Governor of the College in recognition of her dedication.

After graduating, their three children all partnered old collegians of the College keeping the connection to Scopus strong. Now as grandparents, Agnes and Joel take great pleasure watching the next generation of their family enjoy the same values given to their own children. As Joel comments "we are proud and delighted that our six grandchildren are (or soon will be) Scopus students. In particular the sense of Jewish continuity and education is of vital importance to us."

Earlier this year, the Freemans joined the Foundation, because they "felt it was the right time and we are lucky enough to be in a position to do so. It also sets an example within our family for future generations."

Schooling through a Pandemic

When the 2020 school year started no-one could foresee the agility and flexibility that would be required by our community. In our education setting, the notion of remote or distance learning had never before been contemplated. However, in an ever-changing world, by the end of Term 1, the ability to rapidly innovate our existing curriculum delivery became a priority. In the space of a few short days, the creation, development and implementation of 'Scopus@Home' had occurred.

Finding ourselves in an educational setting, a place where learning is at the centre of what we do, we found all members of our community quickly acquiring and learning new skills. It was these skills that would set us up for ongoing success in delivering Scopus@Home. As staff were quickly trained on the use of Zoom, it is important that we acknowledge that during this process that there were many stressful and anxious moments. With the uncertainty around the starting date for Lockdown 1, our collective thinking or wish centred around hoping each day for just one more day of 'regular schooling.' With a desire to ensure they maintained their high professional standards, dedicated staff readily gave up their time to make sure they were up to speed with the technologies required for seamless delivery of synchronous learning. As with anything new, the move to online teaching presented different challenges. It was not enough to just be proficient with the tools and resources available to them in the Google suite, teachers also needed to consider ways to overcome the challenges with regards to maintaining the engagement of students online. In addition, consideration needed to be given to the delivery of content, the structure of lessons, and resources for the new online environment.

Once the everyday teaching was mastered, attention was turned to the ways in which we could value-add to Scopus@Home. We had identified the importance of maintaining the holistic educational offerings, even during a pandemic. This was achieved through the inclusion of key calendar events such as House Athletics, music soirees, Scopus Idol, Baron Snider public speaking competitions and Art exhibitions. Co-curricular offerings were catered for through the delivery of ScopusLife@Home. We are proud of the variety of activities organised for the online involvement of our students throughout this time, meaning that all students were catered for when looking to connect in ways outside of the classroom.

The collegiality amongst peers is something that the teachers of Scopus should be most proud. Teachers readily shared new successes and took pride in both individual and team development. The camaraderie displayed was vital in our success.

If we look to find a silver lining from what 2020 has thrown at Scopus, it is that we have been forced to innovate and rethink ways in which we educate young people and operate as a school. Our newly acquired Tech skills will continue to drive our thinking and planning to be further developed within the 'regular' classroom settings. Whilst it may be tempting to want to return to a pre-covid way of life, it's a new world. An obvious example of change is we won't be returning to Parent/Teacher Interviews in the Rose Hall. There is something to be said about the comforts and efficiencies in running these evenings at home.

Well done to all the members of the Scopus family; we did get through this together.

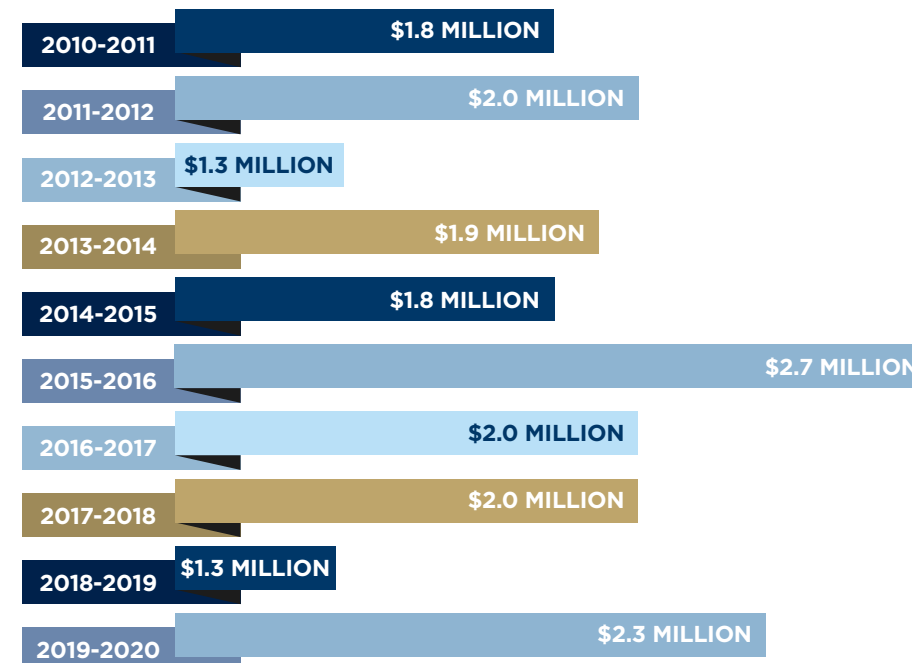

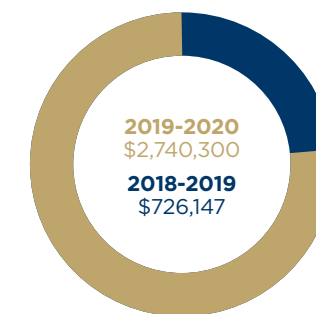

10 YEAR DONATION HISTORY



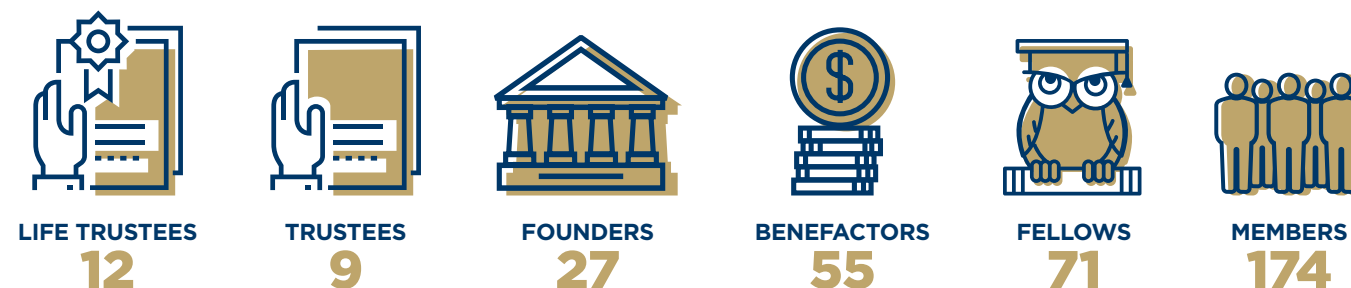

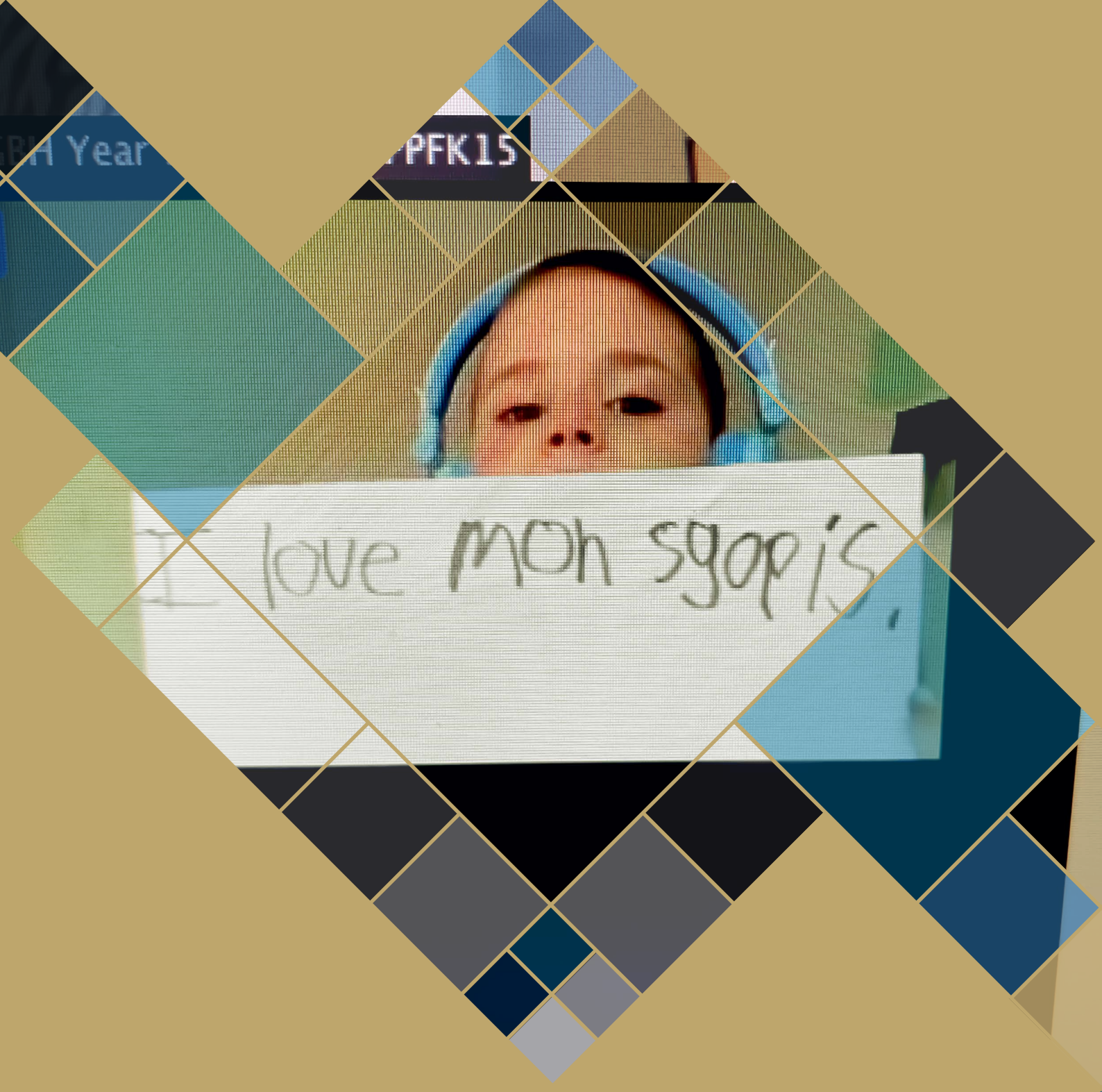
