# President's Report

## Foundation Matters

When I became President of the Foundation five years ago, I, together with the College Leadership, believed it was clear that it was time for a once in 70 year capital works project. This is needed in order to maintain the position of Scopus as one of the leading schools in Victoria and at the forefront of primary and secondary school aged education in the Jewish world. It was also clear that the ongoing rising school fees place a significant burden on our community with many choosing to forgo a Jewish education for their children simply because it is unaffordable.

Scopus has two significant cost inefficiencies – we operate on multiple campuses and because of our location, our parent body must fund the significant transport costs of sending their children to Burwood. The cost of this is currently in excess of \$2500 per child per year. In addition to the cost many students spend multiple hours per day being transported to and from Burwood and the bus network itself is environmentally unfriendly.

Some years ago we started working on a plan that could, hopefully over time, bring down the growth in school fees as well as deal with some of the issues raised above. Relocating the School to a more central location without compromising on space with modernised buildings would enable us to position Scopus in its rightful place for the next 70 years.

Over time, we have built on the planning for world class environments completed by our teaching staff, and asked the daunting question: What if we take our excellent education and move it to where our families live?

We identified the Caulfield Hospital site as an ideal location for the School four years ago and have been working with State and Federal governments and opposition parties as well as other stakeholders to try and acquire the site. The Caulfield Hospital site in totality is larger than our existing Burwood campus and it therefore enables us not only to continue with the benefits we enjoy of our existing large campus, but also to think more innovatively around education and community in a way that one only can having a greenfield site of this size located so close to the Jewish demographic centre.

Before even considering a move, we had to make sure that it made financial sense, and that it was a significantly better option than remaining where we are. 98% of our students live within 5km of the Caulfield Hospital site, 95% within 3km. Earlier this year we shared with you that our ideas were having an impact on decision makers. Our Jewish community organisations have also responded positively to the Caulfield idea and the scope it offers for multipurpose usage, and we are in broad ranging discussions as we continue to develop our plans.

It is our vision that the school will require use of the bulk of the facilities during school hours yet the facilities should be operating from 6am to midnight 6-7 days a week. This provides an opportunity for Melbourne to have a true Jewish Community Centre and for the facilities to be available to those that live in the area and the broader Jewish community. This will fundamentally change the Melbourne Jewish Community and we are very excited about the opportunities it opens up. We do not see it as our role to operate the Community aspects, rather to facilitate their creation.

For Foundation members, this project means at least a decade of opportunities to help build the most significant project ever undertaken in the Australian Jewish Community. We are very cognisant that this is a long term project and we have a School today that operates in Burwood and will continue to operate in Burwood well into the future. We continue to invest responsibly in development at Burwood and are committed to ensuring that our facilities remain at a high standard for students today and not just those in the distant future.

My children, one of whom has already graduated, will finish their education on our current site, and the Foundation will continue to support the College as it stands today. I'm working, however, so that my future grandchildren, together with all our children and grandchildren, continue to have an outstanding and affordable Jewish education based on our Scopus values. I hope you will join me on this journey.

# Foundation Stories



## Helen and David Moses

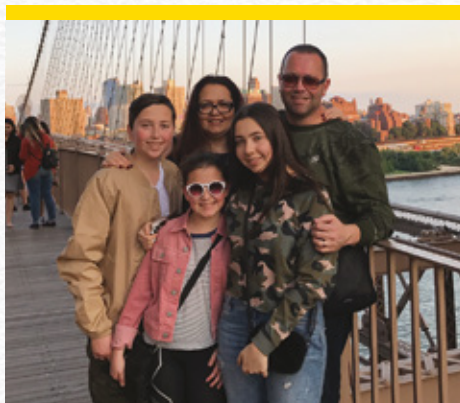
David Moses was born in Carlton and began as a pupil at Mount Scopus in its earliest days at Caulfield synagogue, eventually graduating in 1962.

He remembers great times including being taught in a temporary block in Secondary while new buildings were going up around him, and the particular fun (for the students) where Burwood Highway made a deep dip (near modern day Deakin) and the school bus was unable to pass over an overflowing Gardiner's Creek, necessitating that everyone got out and walked the rest of the way!

Upon meeting Helen at the dances sponsored by 'Club 97' and beginning to raise a family, there was no discussion. Their children were educated at Mount Scopus and now three grandchildren have continued the family tradition.

For this family, as for so many of us, the College has enabled them to forge lifetime friendships. David commented that "Mount Scopus Memorial College is in my blood; it is part of my DNA; it will always be close to my heart."

Helen and David joined the Foundation in 2014 and this year became Benefactors. When David addressed the Grandparents and Special Friends Day last year he asked us "to reflect on the incredible and miraculous growth of the College – this is of course by no small means due to incredible efforts from many notable individuals, families and institutions – all of whom have had the foresight to appreciate the need and benefit of nurturing our present and future generations."



## Tali and Guy Biran

Guy and Tali Biran are new Foundation members who joined our Scopus family five years ago, when their eldest commenced high school.

Raising children with Jewish traditions and with proud Jewish identity in Australia requires a conscious, constant effort and this is why their Jewish education is so important. Tali explains that they chose Mount Scopus because "Guy and I wanted our children to attend a Modern Orthodox Jewish school so they can be exposed to the vast range of traditions, knowledge and Jewish experiences so that one day they can make their own informed choices."

Of particular value to Tali and Guy are the many priceless benefits well beyond the academics, such as raising children who know very well who they are and are proud of their Jewish heritage. They see that the school "has a pivotal role in strengthening our children's Jewish identity and nurturing their Jewish soul."

The Biran family is part of a small but growing set of Foundation members where neither is an Old Collegian. Growing up in Israel, they admit it's often easy to take our Jewish heritage and traditions for granted as there's no need to constantly make sure we preserve our traditions. "When you live in Israel," they say "it's all around you. We feel very fortunate that our three children have the opportunity and privilege to enjoy the Jewish education of MSMC."

For Tali, the Foundation ensures the longevity of all these incredible benefits for our children and future generations. Guy adds that he has recently joined the College Council and encourages anyone who wishes to contribute to get involved.

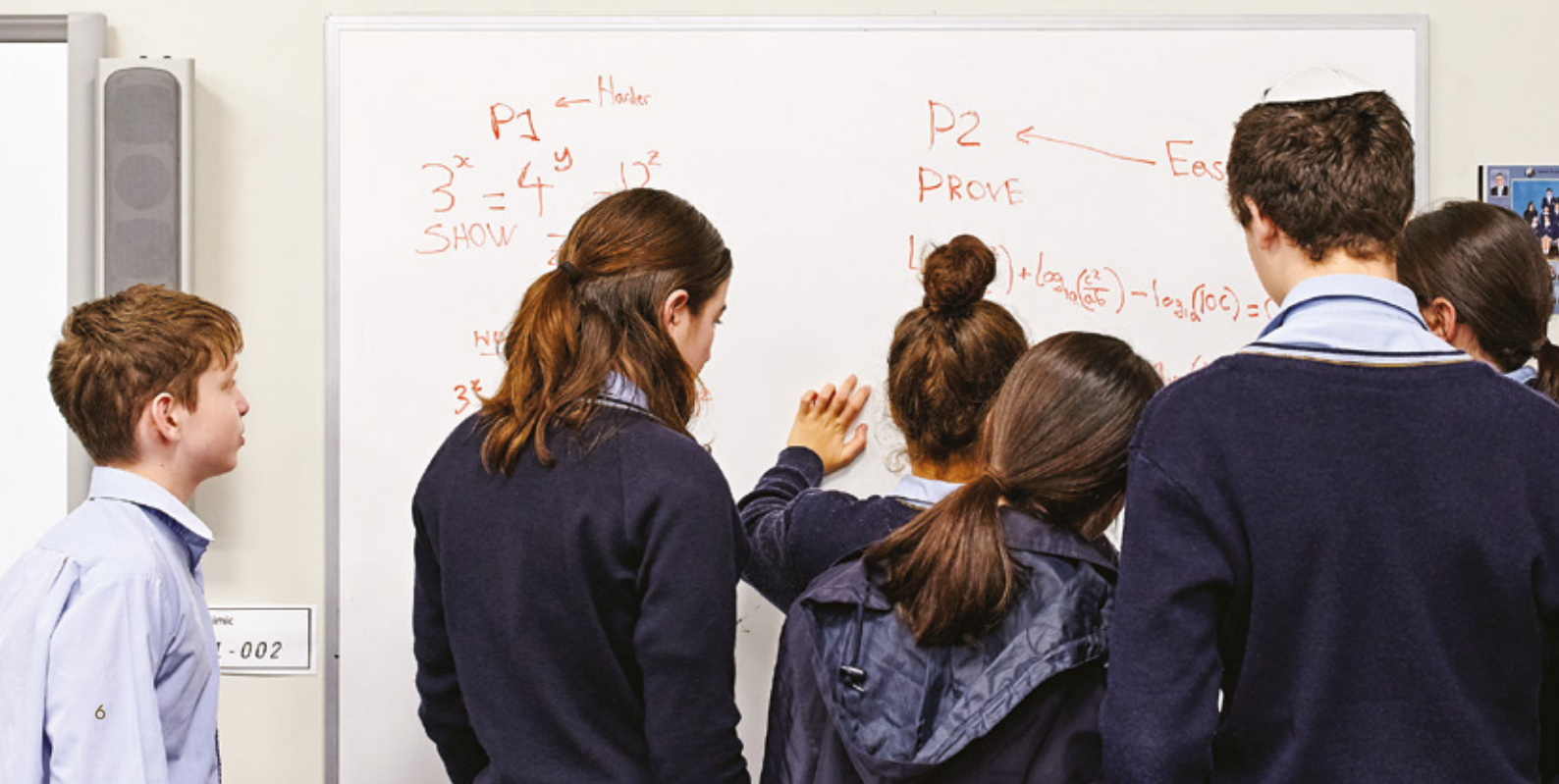
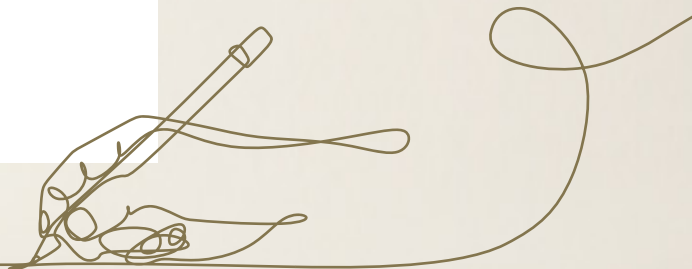

# Music





# Music at Mount Scopus College



The squeaky warm up sound of a violin bow testing strings combines with a sharp toot from a trumpet and the answering honk of a clarinet. It wends its way down the stairs and out to the car park. It's 7:45am at the Gandel Campus and the morning bus has disgorged members of the Marc and Eva Besen orchestra, eager to begin their rehearsal. A few minutes later, the conductor raises his baton and the strains of Yerushalayim Shel Zahav surge through the room. It's another day at Scopus, and it begins, and ends, with music.

Music is undertaken as a class subject until the end of Year 8, and is an elective in Years 9 and 10. Students learn to play music from the earliest grades, and later learn about music history and how to play different instruments. As part of the Year 5 band program, small groups of students learn instruments such as the flute or trombone.

Music is woven through both Jewish and general subjects. At Kabbalat Shabbat the kindergarten students keep the beat on hand drums, while at Chagiga in October the orchestra segues from the Australian national anthem into a Hebrew song.

As we pass the Arnold Bloch Memorial Hall at Gandel Besen House the Year 1s are up on a stage, being put through their songs for the Siddur presentation that week. Volunteer director Lisa Farber reminds them to project their voices out into the auditorium, so we can all hear them.

Mr G, beloved music teacher in the primary school, is introducing his class to the ukulele.

Instrumental lessons on offer include piano, voice, guitar, strings, brass, woodwind, drums and percussion. Music scholarships are offered to promising musicians where possible, and the individual practice rooms of the Eva and Marc Besen School of Music are filled throughout the day as students come to practice or meet with teachers. On the day I visit, some Year 12s are practicing for their Music performance examination, and the primary rock band is practicing through recess.

The most recent studies in education show a correlation between music study and cognitive development. Marita Rosenberg, Music Director, is familiar with the idea of music as a universal language, but also emphasizes the importance music can play in identifying student strengths. "We have students who come to life in this building," she says. "Students who find their passion in making music and contributing to school life through their musical talent." As Kiara Kieser, Class of 2007 puts it: "I lived in the drama centre, the dance studio, the music centre; it really was my second home." Our graduates have gone on to commercial success and some have returned to work with us, but we teach music because it is part of our belief in holistic education. And because it's fun.

- designed a Year 3 Discovery program to launch in 2021

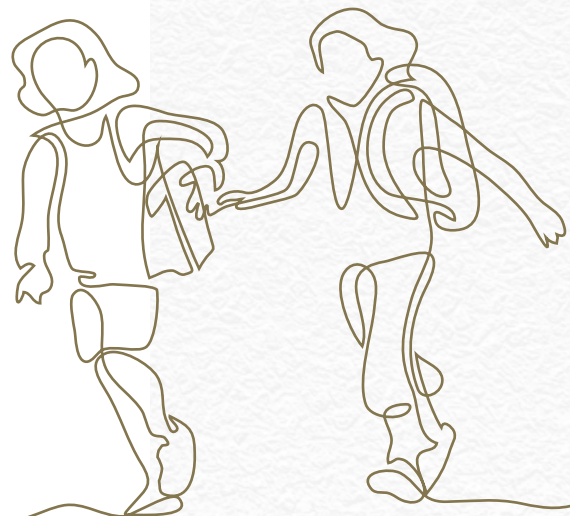

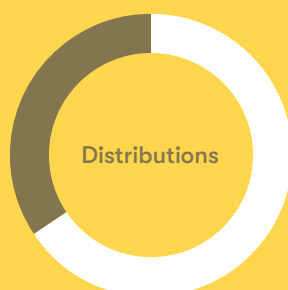

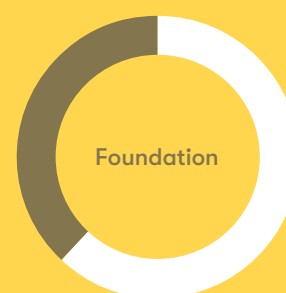
