# Our tribute to Roy Tashi OAM

When Roy Tashi OAM retires from the Foundation Executive this year it will be the end of an amazing chapter of Scopus volunteerism.

We pay tribute to Roy who has served since day one on the Foundation Executive for 30 years! Roy's immeasurable contribution predates that time when, serving on the College Executive, he was part of a small team of visionaries who created the Foundation. Roy has dedicated himself to Scopus since 1984 having been an Annual Appeal Chair, College Vice President, Acting College President and Foundation Executive Vice President.

Garry Stock, College President 1987 – 1994, says "Roy's contribution to the Foundation cannot be underestimated. He has always led by example. He and Sylvia gave what they believed the College needed and what they felt was appropriate to show the way. Roy has also led by displaying untiring energy in attracting new gifts and new members for the Foundation, and of critical importance, new volunteers and leadership for the Foundation Executive."

Garry also recalls that in their desire to encourage more fundraising, they established the Roy and Sylvia Tashi Award for Excellence in Fundraising, to be awarded to volunteers who were creative, passionate, and above all, successful in raising the bar.

Garry continues on a personal note. "Roy, may I say thank you. I remember the day when you said to me Garry, I am available and prepared to help. Any role you want to give me. And it did not take long before he was a driving force at the College."

"Roy can always be relied upon to provide outstanding advice and support and he has been a steadfast fundraiser who operates at the highest level of integrity. Roy and Sylvia have raised a family rich in Jewish values and imbued with a desire to continue their philanthropic work. They now count two daughters and three grandchildren as graduates of the College, together with another four grandchildren currently at Scopus.
