ELIZABETH AND NICHOLAS SLEZAK MULTIMEDIA AND TECHNOLOGY CENTRE

IN THIS 'INFORMATION AGE' a first-class education requires an extensive knowledge of rapidly developing information technologies.

By bringing the Schools of Information Technology and Media Studies together with the Library into one modern facility, the College recognises their complementary interaction and integration. Today, the education depends more and more on the ability to research information from around the world, to analyse and develop this material and subsequently, to present it in a sophisticated manner. Technology resources in all areas of the Slezak Centre will be engaged to teach every subject across the curriculum and will enhance co-curricular activity.

In addition, the Slezak Centre will be the home of the Merkaz – Centre for Informal Jewish Education and Leadership – a hub for student activity and Jewish Life, making it a distinctive and powerful presence on the Gandel Campus.

Facing the quadrangle, a large screen features an image depicting the connection between the Jewish people and our School with its Australian and Jewish heritage, which has been created by Emmanuel Santos.

BIRCH FAMILY SCHOOL OF MEDIA STUDIES

Catering for one of the fastest growing interests of our students, the Birch Family School of Media Studies is strategically located with the Library and School of Information Technology. Our School of Media Studies provides a large studio for filming and three editing suites, one of which is directly linked to the studio, to enable students a 'real life' experience of media production. It will also be the home of the school radio station along with the Media Studies and AV technical staff.

BRUCE FINK SCHOOL OF INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

The School of Information Technology comprises five fully integrated technology driven classrooms and the Resource Centre. The larger than normal size classrooms enable separate teaching areas for practical applications and for theoretical study for all subjects. Each contains a data projector, clusters of computers, scanners and printers. They surround a vast Resource Centre, where students may independently pursue computer based research at any time, and offices for technical and support staff.

GERSH FAMILY MERKAZ

The Gersh Family Merkaz is the Centre for Informal Jewish Education and Leadership programs which are pivotal to the whole school philosophy. It is a hub of activity providing flexible spaces for group activities and administrative areas for our informal Jewish Studies educators and the Sherut Leumi girls. This team coordinates the Outreach and Israel programs, Year 11 Conference, Assemblies, Camps, Chagim and the fostering of student leadership.

SUSIE AND NORMAN ROCKMAN LIBRARY

The Library has been enlarged and renewed to maximise natural light. Computers, and the ability to bring laptops and be wirelessly connected to the Internet, allow students to make the most of all its resources. A large reading area, the Sophie and Norman Kave Lounge, offers a relaxed space adjacent to the balcony. A dedicated teaching space allows teachers and students to utilise all resources whilst being part of a class environment. Three seminar rooms afford space for private study or small group tutorials.

THE SCREEN AND ITS IMAGE

Emmanuel Santos, its creator, explains the symbolism of an artwork that pays tribute to the past and to the present, and that inspires hope for the future.

"Masada and Uluru represent the solid foundations of our two ancient cultures that have endured change and are central to our Australian Jewish identity.

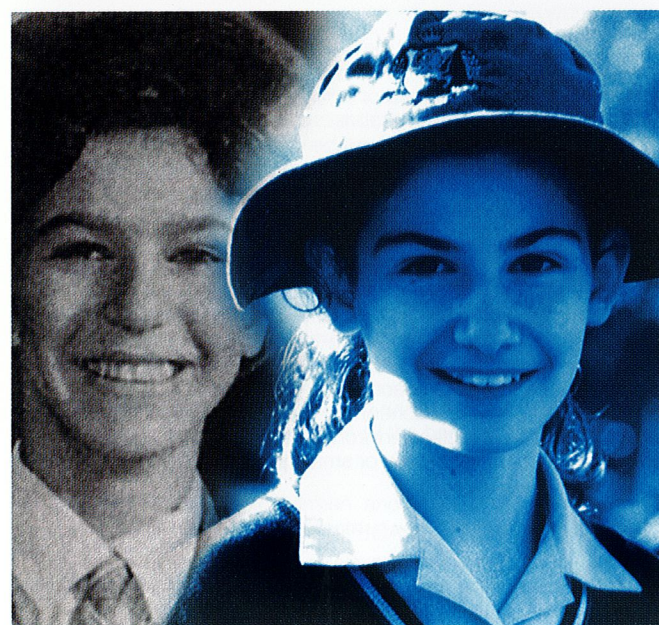
Other symbols of Jewish history, tradition and culture, include: seven sections of the Kotel forming a giant Menorah, 16th century Russian Synagogue, electrified fences of Auschwitz, piety, Israeli flags and the Magen David and doves of peace.

The 'Hora' is a symbol of unity, strength, 'smachot' and the celebration of Jewish life".

MOUNT SCOPUS COLLEGE FOUNDATION

The Mount Scopus College Foundation was established in 1987 to be responsible for major fundraising for the College. Funds raised can be applied to capital works, endowment, tuition fee subsidies, debt reduction and programs.

Members of the Foundation include corporations, individuals and families and classifications of membership are dependent on gift level. Entry level requires a pledge of \$20,000 which may be paid over an agreed term.

Through the generosity of its members, the Foundation has raised in excess of \$30,000,000 since 1987.

The Chairman of the Foundation, since inception, is Solomon Lew and the current President, Henry Lanzer, was appointed in 1996. The goals of the Foundation are pursued by an Executive Committee supported by an Executive Director, currently Marilyn Simon.

Creation of the Susie and Eric Stock Drama Studio, extended Sport and PE facilities.

1997

Launch of the '5 year - \$8,000,000' Capital Campaign by the Hon. Peter Costello, Federal Treasurer. The Baker Family Cafeteria and the George and Gita Smorgon Sports Complex were completed at the Gandel Campus.
