Introducing Hilton Rubin Principal Designate

Hilton Rubin, who takes the reigns of Mount Scopus College on Rabbi Altshul's departure in December, has been the Primary Headmaster since 1992.

The Rubin family - wife Chana, children Kerryn, Joni and Leigh-hail from South Africa where Hilton was Deputy Principal of Herzlia in Capetown and Principal of Carmel High School in Pretoria. In 1985 they immigrated to New Zealand where Hilton served as Principal of Kadimah College.

From the Chairman and the President.....

It is a privilege to share with you, in this report for Foundation members, some of the highlights and exciting plans for the future development of Mount Scopus College.

The Story So Far

Since the establishment of the Mount Scopus College Foundation in 1987, it has been responsible for all the major fundraising for the College which has enabled the completion of many worthwhile and necessary projects for the school.

- In 1989, with the assistance of the Alter, Hansky and Lubansky families, the College was able to build another floor onto the Adolph Basser Wing providing 2 outstanding new science rooms, and a modern art facility.
- Also at this time, 3 state-of- the-art modular classrooms were purchased for the Smorgon Family Primary School, followed by 2 more in 1993.
- In 1994, the Eva and Marc Besen School of Music was dedicated in recognition of their long standing commitment and generosity to the College, especially in the area of the Performing Arts.
 - In 1994 the Gandel family made a \$1,500,000 gift to the College resulting in an investment in capital refurbishments, facilities and building projects.

These included:

- * the total refurbishment of 19 classrooms in the Korman Wing
- * the replacement of lockers for 600 students and the upgrading of the corridors.


- * the refurbishment of 8 toilet blocks in the Secondary School and the Smorgon Family Primary School.
- * the refurbishment of another chemistry laboratory and the development of a new biology laboratory.
- * providing a new computer laboratory for the Smorgon Family Primary School and a total upgrade of all student and staff computer facilities, including the computerisation of the libraries.
- * replacing and acoustically balancing the ceiling and upgrading the lighting of the Ray and Gerald Rose Hall.
- In 1995, as an acknowledgment of the largest pledge ever made to the College, and of the generosity of the Gandel family, the Burwood campus was dedicated in their honour.
- In 1995 the building of an extension to the Rose Hall created the Susie and Eric Stock Drama Studio, and office and storage space for the Physical Education and Sport Departments.
- In 1996 the exterior of the buildings at the Gandel Campus were rendered and painted, and the grounds at Gandel Besen House were enhanced.

The Way Ahead . . . \$8 Million Capital Campaign


This year, after extensive consultation with educationalists, staff and parents of the College, the Executive of the Board of Governors has identified the physical projects that must be built to allow the College to progress and maintain its excellent programs. The Executive of the Foundation is already initiating the steps to raise a further \$8,000,000 for these building works that form the priorities for the Capital Campaign for the next five years.

The determined Five Year Plan includes:

- redevelopment of the current Bus Park, incorporating a new entrance to the College and providing play areas and improved bus and car parking.
- a Performing Arts Centre.
- renovation of the change rooms attached to the Lustig and Moar Pool, and the upgrading and redevelopment of sporting ovals at both the Gandel Campus and the grounds at Gandel Besen House.
- the Elizabeth and Nicholas Slezak Multi Media and Resource Centre incorporating an extensive audio-visual centre, additional computer facilities, seminar rooms and a modern theatrette.
- completion of the refurbishment of senior science rooms.
- a multi-purpose Primary Hall.

The College continues with its own program of refurbishments, upgrades and maintenance. A new student and staff Cafeteria will be completed by the start of the 1997 school year, partially funded by donations to the 1996 Annual Appeal. We are also in receipt of a generous bequest from the Nicholas Slezak Estate which will enable the development of the first stages of the Elizabeth and Nicholas Slezak Multi Media and Resource Centre. A dedicatory plaque is to be unveiled at the Gandel Campus on the morning of 28 November, 1996.

We look forward to seeing all of you at the formal Foundation Campaign Dinner planned for 26 February, 1997 at the Plaza Ballroom, Regent Theatre. We are delighted that the Hon. Peter Costello M.P., Federal Treasurer, has agreed to be our Keynote Speaker which has highlighted, once again, the high esteem in which the
