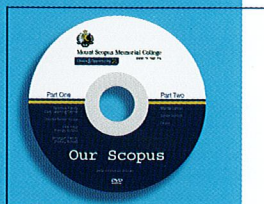

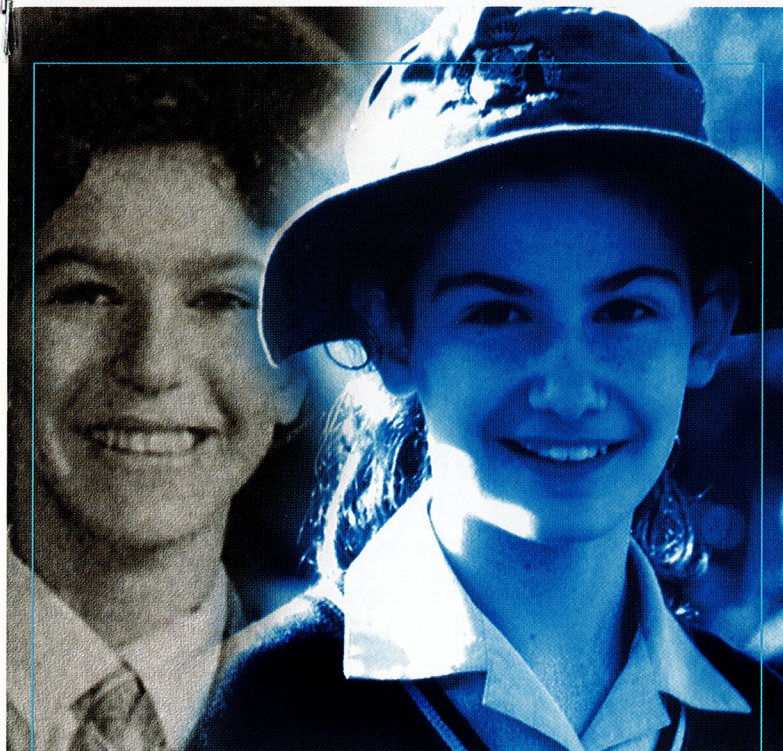

MOUNT SCOPUS COLLEGE FOUNDATION

The Mount Scopus College Foundation was established in 1987 to be responsible for major fundraising for the College. Funds raised can be applied to capital works, endowment, tuition fee subsidies, undertaking debt reduction and programs.

Members of the Foundation include corporations, individuals and families and classifications of membership are dependent on gift level.

Through the generosity of its members, the Foundation has raised in excess of \$29,000,000 for the College since 1987.

Foundation funds over that time have predominately funded capital works projects and fee relief programs. The current campaign for 'Our Shared Vision' – shared with the College – incorporates campus renewal, the creation of a substantial Endowment Fund and core debt reduction.

The Chairman of the Foundation, since inception, is Solomon Lew and the current President, Henry Lanzer, was appointed in 1996. The goals of the Foundation are pursued by an Executive Committee supported by an Executive Director, currently Marilyn Simon.

FOUNDATION HIGHLIGHTS

1987

Creation of the Mount Scopus College Foundation

1988 - 1996

Construction of science and art facilities, with the assistance of the Alter, Hansky and Lubansky families. Five modular classrooms purchased for the Smorgon Family Primary School.

\$3,769,000 distributed to the College for subsidised tuition fees.

The Gandel Family gift provided for major refurbishment (upgrading classrooms and science laboratories, expanding computer facilities, computerisation of libraries, improvements to Rose Hall). In appreciation the Burwood Campus was dedicated as the Gandel Campus in 1995.

Creation of the Susie and Eric Stock Drama Studio, extended Sport and PE facilities.

1996

Exterior of the buildings at the Gandel Campus and the grounds at Gandel Besen House enhanced.

A Masterplan for the future of the College was determined by the College Community.

1997

Launched '5 year - \$8,000,000' Capital Campaign.

The Baker Family Cafeteria was completed at the Gandel Campus.

The George and Gita Smorgon Sports Complex was completed incorporating the Rita and Sam Kras Basketball Centre, Kras Payes Weinman Recreation Centre, Jenny and Noel Levin Sports Pavilion, Lustig and Moar Aquatic Centre, Margie and Michael Small Tennis Centre and the Jack Skolnik Oval.

2000

The Besen Family Performing Arts Centre - Alter Family Auditorium, Baron and Tashi Foyer and Plaza and the Yvonne and Leon Fink Amphitheatre - and housing the Eva and Marc Besen School of Music and Susie and Eric Stock School of Drama, was completed.

An expanded Fink Karp Ivany Campus was rededicated.

2001

The new Station Street entry to the Gandel Campus, bus and car park was completed alongside a new Hockey and Soccer Field.

A long term, cross Campus Masterplan – Our Shared Vision – is developed and the Foundation Executive accepts the challenge to raise the funds for its implementation.

2002

The refurbishment of the existing Szalmuk Family Early Learning Centre is completed and construction of its additional facilities begins.

2003

Dedication of the renewed and expanded Szalmuk Family Early Learning Centre.
Commencement of the Slezak Multimedia and Technology Centre.

2004

Construction of the Slezak Multimedia and Technology Centre. Ground floor to be completed by end of November 2004. Completion and Dedication scheduled for May 2005.

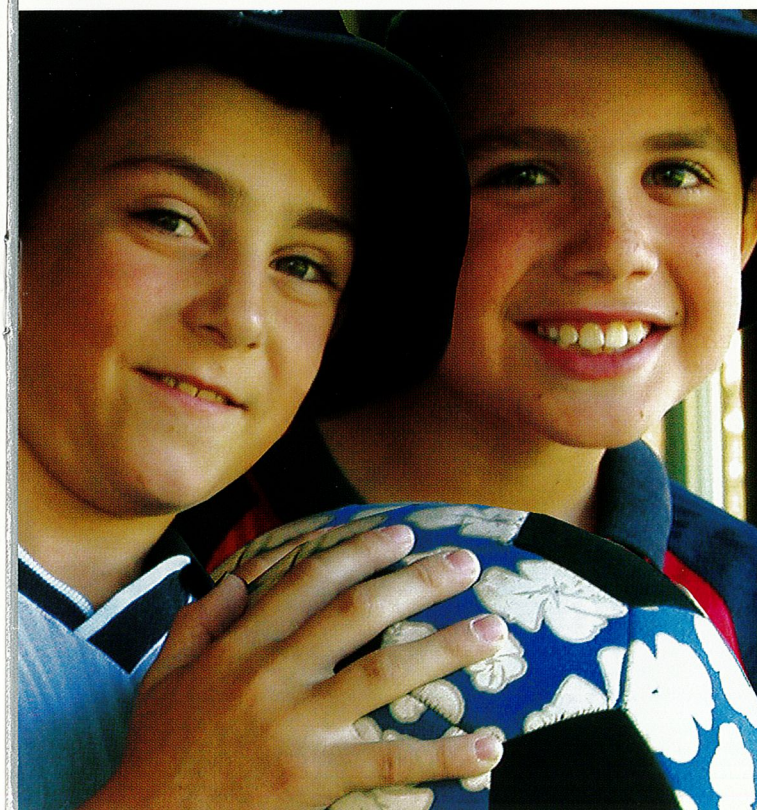
