

From the Chairman and the President

Thank you for taking the time to review the 2009 Mount Scopus College Foundation Annual Report.





SOLOMON LEW CHAIRMAN HENRY LANZER PRESIDENT As anticipated, the last twelve months have been most challenging with the plans of individuals, businesses and organisations around the world having been adversely affected by the global financial crisis.

For the College, the influence of the economic downturn was exacerbated by the rise of costs in education together with significant teacher salary increases necessitating larger than usual fee increases. You may remember that, as a result, extensive redevelopment plans were put on hold.

The Foundation then turned its focus to 'keeping kids at Scopus' by seeking the ability to minimise the fee increase and to fund more bursaries. A projected rise of nearly 15% was able to be reduced to 9.75% and more families had their burden eased by receiving subsidised school fees.

This was achieved with the outstanding generosity of some of the College's major benefactors, to whom we say a warm and sincere 'toda raba'.

However, since that time, the College has gratefully been the beneficiary of federal government stimulus funding for new primary schools at Gandel Besen House and the Gandel Campus.

As a result, the College has created a Stage 1 of each of these exciting projects, for which the government will provide one quarter of their cost.

Appreciating that these are generational projects for Scopus, the Foundation Executive has endorsed these developments with the understanding that their completion will require immediate Foundation support.

Over the course of the year, despite an ailing economy, fundraising has continued and we have truly appreciated both new support, that of members who have met their commitments and those who have made new gifts. Thank you.

We also recognise the involvement and assistance of our Executive and express our sincere gratitude to Vice-Presidents Sam Alter and Stewart Baron together with Paul Bassat, Joey Borensztajn, Russell Casper, Jack Hansky, Michael Slonim, Roy Tashi and Executive Director, Marilyn Simon.

Similarly, we acknowledge the immense commitment, enthusiasm and co-operation of Principal, Rabbi James Kennard, and all staff together with College President, Lisa Kennett, the College Executive and Councilors.

This year we were saddened by the passing of many longtime Foundation supporters. Our thoughts are with all their families and we especially note the loss of Life Trustee, Richard Pratt and Trustee, Victor Smorgon for our community, the wider Australian society and for Israel.

2010 will be an exciting year as we watch buildings quickly take shape and reveal a new era for Scopus. We know we can count on you to provide the support it needs to provide a quality education in contemporary facilities for future generations.

Your support not only affects their environment but, more importantly, the number of children who will be fortunate enough to have this experience. Together, we will provide the "Strength and Courage to Build our Foundation for the Future".

The College is proceeding with new primary schools at Gandel Besen House and the Gandel Campus as a result of federal government funding and with the understanding that their completion will require Foundation support. In line with government requirements, these generational projects are to be completed for the start of the 2011 school year.

At Gandel Besen House the addition of a new two storey building will provide

- open, flexible and interactive learning spaces, facilitating multi-faceted learning environments for Prep to Year 3
- learning resource centre
- music and art rooms
- computer pods

At the Gandel Campus an entirely new upper primary school adjacent to the Besen Family Performing Arts Centre will feature


- flexible learning spaces, allowing classrooms to be used in a variety of ways for Years 4 to 6
- learning resource centre
- Year 6 'work, rest and play' zone combined with an informal Jewish education centre
- wireless access throughout

Both projects incorporate

- the use of recycled water, energy saving lights and air conditioning
- environmentally sustainable designs



The direction for some of the proceeds from this substantial Bequest are Aaron Arthur Smith Bursaries which have been awarded to students in need of fee assistance.



- development of facilities or you may identify a specific purpose





WHY WAS THE MOUNT SCOPUS COLLEGE FOUNDATION ESTABLISHED?
