President's Report

Almost a decade ago, the journey began to consolidate Scopus' three campuses and establish a Centre for Jewish Life in the heart of Caulfield.

The Foundation set about working with the College to bring this vision to life and at many stages, the challenges seemed overwhelming. But if I've learnt anything over this period it's that persistence and dreaming big are a powerful combination.

At our Gala Dinner at the end of 2024 we announced a key stage of Project Generation - that Scopus was moving to the western perimeter of the Caulfield Racecourse.

This is a project that is not just about Scopus but about how we can use this move to radically change the trajectory of the Melbourne Jewish community for the better. Over the last 17 months our community, along with Jews all over the world, has faced record levels of antisemitism and hate, with our school directly impacted by terrible graffiti that no student should have to see.

What has been reinforced for me during this period is that the best antidote to antisemitism is a strong Jewish identity. What better way to support this than through the creation of a place where every Jew can feel safe and proud to be themselves.

Our hope is that the Project Generation campaign results in more Jewish children having the chance to receive a life-changing Jewish education through reduced school fees. We also envision the Centre for Jewish Life will be a new home for Jewish communal organisations, for as we know this campaign is about the future of the whole community, not just Scopus.

Above all else, this is a once in a many generations opportunity; to provide a fantastic future for Scopus students and Melbourne Jewry to come.

Thank you to all of you who have been part of the journey so far, and in particular, our committed members and donors who have made this milestone possible through your generous donations and pledges. Your support truly makes a tangible difference to the College and our students, and consequently to the future of Melbourne's Jewish community.

Our Foundation Executive continues to give their time and financial commitment to help make Scopus what it is and will become, and for this, and more, I thank them. They've been invaluable in supporting this vision, and our Foundation professional team have also contributed by working tirelessly on the ground.

This year has seen its fair share of challenges, and as I write this hostages still remain in Gaza and families are going through immeasurable pain to bring them home. We stand in solidarity with them, and Israel, and pray for their return and the safety of the IDF.

What we have also seen this year is a strength and resilience unlike any other in my lifetime, and a community that rises up despite the pain we endure. Scopus continues to produce proud, confident and compassionate Jewish students and on the school's 75th birthday, it is time for us all to emulate the strength of our ancestors and work together to create a future for the generations to come.

I invite you to join us on your part of the journey.

Executive Director update

2024 has been a year of celebrations and heartbreak. We commemorated Scopus' 75th birthday with fantastic school-wide and community events, and welcomed back alumni from the very first school cohort of 1949. We also continued to work on Project Generation, our plan to consolidate Scopus into the heart of Caulfield, which is closer than ever before.

Yet our community is hurting, as we look towards Israel and see our brothers and sisters still fighting for the return of hostages and a peaceful existence in their land.

We too are shocked at the antisemitism here at home, and continue to work and pray for an Australia where our children feel safe and comfortable to be themselves.

The Scopus Foundation was fortunate to welcome guest speakers in 2024 that spoke to these very emotions and concerns. International educators and commentators Haviv Rettig Gur and Ben M. Freeman shared their insights on Israel and Judaism post 7 October. We were also privileged to host an exclusive screening of Sheryl Sandberg's documentary Screams Before Silence, as well as other events in people's homes. We look forward to providing more opportunities to connect and come together in 2025.

This year saw a large jump in donations to the Foundation, for which we are very grateful. We also continued to welcome new members and see increased levels of giving from existing supporters. We know that school affordability remains a key challenge for the whole community, coupled with the increased demand for a Jewish education over the last 16 months, given the rise in antisemitism and desire to build strong Jewish identities in our children.

We thank our members who have given generously to the school's bursaries and programs to help more families become Scopus families. We also believe Project Generation will actively assist with these challenges. It's never been more important for us to all work together so we can ensure every student has access to a world-class Jewish education.

In 2024 the Foundation team said goodbye to CEO Mark Joel, after five years in the role. Mark and Pearl's five children all live in Israel and Mark knows more of his time will be increasingly spent in Tel Aviv and Jerusalem. We wish him all the best and thank him for his dedication to the Scopus Foundation and hard work over the years. Victoria Rodan, our Alumni and Family Relations Coordinator, also welcomed beautiful baby boy Ike and we all look forward to welcoming them both back to the office in early 2025.

Our Foundation achievements this past year are many, and we continue to be encouraged by our members' generosity and support. As we look towards 2025 and the onset of the Project Generation campaign, we are focussed on growing our membership base and working with all of you to bring this life-changing opportunity to fruition. Our students, our families and our community are counting on it.

May 2025 bring us a year of connection, growth and peace.

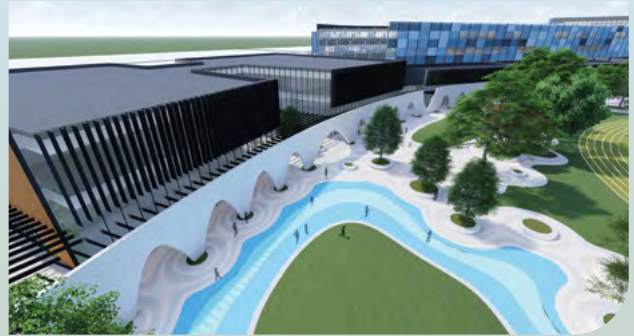

Foundation Gala Dinner



Around 500 Foundation members, as well as Federal and State politicians and other dignitaries, attended the Foundation Gala Dinner in December to celebrate the school's 75th birthday.

Guest of honour Tzipi Livni, former Foreign Minister, Attorney General and Deputy Prime Minister of Israel, sat down with Australian journalist Gemma Tognini, for an in-depth discussion about the Middle East, the current war in Gaza and Jewish life today.

The room was also treated to a spectacular live performance by Eden Golan, Israel's representative at the 2024 Eurovision song contest, where she performed her hit song October Rain. She also closed out the evening with a moving rendition of the Hatikvah.

Students across Years 4 to 12 performed songs in both Hebrew and English, while Victorian Premier Jacinta Allan spoke to the crowd. Then-Victorian Opposition Leader John Pesutto and Australian Senator James Paterson also spoke.



The establishment of the Marc Besen Prize was announced on the night, acknowledging the significant impact the late Marc Besen AC z"l had for many decades at Scopus.

The inaugural award was presented by Premier Allan to Lisa Farber and Justin Liberman, for their substantial impact on the College, the Foundation and our students.

The Foundation has never bestowed an award, and the creation of the Marc Besen Prize recognises Marc's substantial contribution to Scopus. The Marc Besen Prize will be presented from time to time to a Foundation member who not only has been generous by way of their philanthropic contribution but just as importantly through their time and intellect has a profound impact on the direction of Scopus.

Foundation Families: Michael and Miriam Suss and family



When Mount Scopus opened its doors on St Kilda Rd in 1949, a young Michael Suss began his school journey at its kindergarten. Seventy-six years later and he still talks about his time at the College fondly.

“Scopus was really a miracle,” he says. “Our parents had such foresight.”

Michael and his three siblings attended Scopus in those early years but four children at a private school was financially tough. One day, Michael and his brother Allen were moved to Princes Hill public school as Michael's father Hans told then-Principal Abe Feiglin that he couldn't afford the school fees anymore.

“Abe Feiglin said, ‘I want the kids back here tomorrow, we'll work something out,’ and from that day on, parents with multiple children got a discount,” recalls Michael.

“Abe Feiglin was a visionary,” adds Michael's wife Miriam, herself an Old Collegian. “There are so many people who talk about how he encouraged them, that their lives and careers were due to him.”

Michael and Miriam both recall teachers in those early post-war years as being Holocaust survivors, and how Scopus gave them the opportunity to start anew. They describe how the school was its own community, strong and resilient despite the horrors everyone had escaped, and how people banded together to create new lives for Jewish children in Australia.

“I left Mount Scopus with self-confidence, that I can take on the world,” says Michael. “We knew we were different, we knew the school was different and it didn't bother us. We came out proud regardless, we were Jewish Australians.”

“My education at Scopus was the best thing that ever happened to me,” adds Miriam. “All my closest friendships, my confidence, everything is down to Scopus.”

Today, Miriam and Michael are proud grandparents to current and former Scopus students. They refer lovingly to one grandchild who excelled academically but equally found passion in his involvement with Scopus musicals, and another grandchild who loves spending time in the Gandel Campus' Kitchen Garden. They have a deep appreciation for the high-quality education that Scopus provides, but also the opportunity it gives students to have a well-rounded experience and make lifelong friends.

“Scopus helped to make us and is helping to make our grandchildren,” says Miriam. “It infuses our social and family life, it's part of our identity and cultural and community involvement.”

They both agree that being a member of the Scopus Foundation is so important because it helps others access a Jewish education and have the same opportunities they were so fortunate to receive.

“Both of us are very committed to Jewish continuity, it applies to our children and grandchildren but it applies equally to people in the community who would like to send their kids to Scopus but can't afford to do so,” says Miriam.

“The community helped us get an education and we feel we should respond in a similar way if we're able to,” adds Michael.

“It's all part of the tzedakah feeling that what you're doing can be magnified to assist other people.”

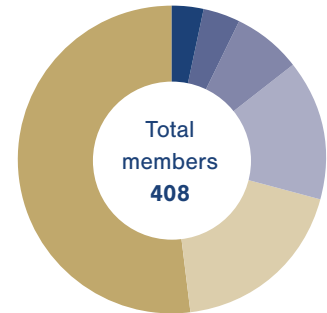
